

TAKING PART IN AN AREA QUALIFIER

When considering registering your interest for an Area Qualifier, to check your horse is eligible for the competition you will need to check the rules on vaccinations, and in particular the FLU vaccinations and their timings, as they may differ from what your Vet has advised. You may still be able to compete if there is time to start your vaccinations again before the competition.

EQUINE INFLUENZA (NB: current advisory is for an immediate Flu Booster if not already received within the last six months)

The rules can seem a little confusing but to simplify this however a Flu vac checker is available within the BRC Handbook which will calculate your times for you, or you can ask a committee to check them for you. See CR Appendix 13.

The horse or pony must have received:

1st injection followed by

2nd injection which is given not less than 21 days and not more than 92 days after the first

3rd Injection - a first booster injection which is given not less than 150 days and not more than 215 days after the 2nd Injection

Further annual booster injections at intervals of not more than a year apart.

Horses may compete at BRC Competitions providing that they have had the first two primary injections but no injection should have been given on any of the 6 days before a competition.

In the event of failure to comply with any of the requirements of this rule, the horse or pony will be disqualified and not permitted to take part in any competition.

The vaccination section of the horse's passport must have been completed by a Veterinary Surgeon who is not the owner of the horse or pony.

In addition, please check the specific eligibility rules for the level you would like to be considered for. Some rules may apply to the horse regardless of who was riding it!

British Riding Clubs will check all horses that have qualified with the relevant disciplines governing bodies and if found not to be eligible will be disqualified. This may mean that the whole team is then demoted if yours was a counting score, so if in doubt please check or contact one of the committee and ask them to check for you.

You may still be able to compete but at a different level.

The full rules for all the British Riding clubs' competitions can be found on the British Riding clubs' website as a free download.

Microchips

Microchips From 1st October 2018, all horses in England (not just those born since 2009) will have to be microchipped by law. There will be a two year grace period however, to give time to organise getting older horses' microchipped. So from 1st October 2020, it will be an enforceable law. After this date all horses attending a BRC Qualifier or Championship (regardless of where they reside) must be microchipped if not they will be disqualified.
